The Building of:	The four best barrels, wild-yeast fermented in stainless steel, 100% barrel aged (no new) for 19 months: 50% one year, 25% two year, 25% older. Bottled unfiltered in May 2020.	
Ageability:	Please, the 2018s are big wines, and we absolutely recommend that you consider decanting to get it some air within its first three years. This wine should easily climb in complexity beyond ten years.	
Vineyards:	Our dry-farmed, organic, St. Dolores Estate (10 years) continues to bring that anomaly, of both structured while at the same time juicy, from the vines to the wines. It's a pretty place, and we are thoughtfully farming the idea of substantial from it.
